Sunrise Bethel Christian School was established in 2009 after several years of meticulous planning, extensive research, and thoughtful discussions. The school's founding principal, Mr. Roger Tumes, along with his wife Jill and Sunrise teacher, Mr. Caleb Cure, played a crucial role in laying the foundation of a Biblically-based curriculum. The school prioritises academic excellence alongside the discovery of Christian faith.

In February 2020, Edai Christian School in Edai Town was officially opened by Sir Moi Avei. The opening was also marked by the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between Boera Holdings, ACS International, and Edai Town Development to establish an education hub. The school works closely with the four villages in the Hiri West LLG of Porebada, Papa, LeaLea, and Boera, which are determined to embrace quality education for their children's future. ECS is a campus of Sunrise Bethel Christian School (SBCS).

Sunrise Bethel Christian and Edai Christian Schools are governed by ACS International Schools (ACS IS), which is connected to the Adelaide Christian School community.

The Governing Board of ACS IS has a heart for quality Christian education to help support and encourage families across Papua New Guinea. The primary goal is to establish schools and teacher training in Papua New Guinea. The aim is to have well-trained, qualified teachers in many cities, towns, and villages.

Why teach in Papua New Guinea?

Papua New Guinea is one of the most culturally diverse countries in the world, with over 850 languages spoken and a wide variety of ethnicities and religions, but it is also one of the least explored places in the world.

Immerse yourself in the authentic cultural experience of Papua New Guinea, where the population lives in traditional villages just as they have for hundreds of years. A

small ex-pat community adds to the unique charm of the place. Although modern comforts may be scarce, connecting with a rich, authentic way of life is priceless.

Teaching in Papua New Guinea also offers you the opportunity to:

- Experience and influence transformative change
- Develop mentorship skills and provide educational know-how to train, inspire and disciple staff
- Spread God's word to a global community and
- Build connections and friendships with our overseas staff and partners.

The position

We welcome applications for a Primary Teacher/Mentor/Coordinator/Leader. This position is full-time (1.0 FTE) and is for 1 year. (Further years on negotiation).

Primary Grade Teacher/Leader responsibilities include:

- Part-time teaching load
- Supporting teachers with in-class instruction through monitoring weekly planning, locating manipulative resources to foster quality instruction, and providing instructional strategies through one-on-one discussion and/or demonstration lessons
- Help orientate newly recruited teachers
- Schedule and lead regular team meetings where members are given support with current program requirements (i.e. summative assessments, termly report cards), information on whole school events, and support with individual students and
- Prepare and present professional development sessions in school across the two schools.

Other details

As a truly missional experience, teachers are paid wages that are commensurate with local wages (estimated at \$20,000AUD). We offer FREE accommodation consisting of an air-conditioned room, bathroom, kitchen and living area in a secure area on the school property. As a teacher, you'll have access to a shared vehicle.

Teaching Requirements in Papua New Guinea

Teaching English in Papua New Guinea presents an extraordinary opportunity for educators seeking a unique and culturally immersive experience. A Bachelor of

Education Degree or Teaching Diploma is required as a standard qualification for teaching positions, ensuring a solid foundation of knowledge and expertise.

Teachers must obtain a work permit to work legally in Papua New Guinea, ensuring compliance with immigration regulations. Adelaide Christian Schools will prepare and process these documents.

Teaching in Papua New Guinea offers a rewarding experience that contributes to children's educational growth while immersing oneself in the country's rich cultural heritage and stunning natural landscapes.

The impact of this role is immeasurable for the individual, families and the country as a whole.
